Under the Bell Tower

CHAOS THEORY AND PRACTICE

“Chaos Theory” is a scientific idea that is intended to describe how random “cause and effect” is. It goes to some really outlandish extremes to illustrate that it is not possible to predict how one action causes another. For example (an outlandish example): a butterfly flaps its wings in Dover, Delaware, and this creates air movement. The air movement throws a bird’s flight off course by a ten-thousandth of a degree, causing the bird to land awkwardly on a power line and get shocked to death. The electrical short the bird caused in the power line shuts down a local power station and so a computer somewhere re-directs electricity from another power station to keep the lights on in the first location. But the second power station just happens to supply electricity to a factory where they make the shells for military tank guns, and the momentary flutter in the power supply causes a tiny hole to form where a mechanical welder is sealing a shell. That shell gets shipped to the Army, and the Army sends it to Iraq where it is loaded onto a great big Abrams tank. The tank gets into a fire fight with an al-Qaeda group and tries to fire the defective shell. The gun jams, the al-Qaeda fighters shoot all the members of the tank crew, including one young man who could have gone on to become President of the United States and make world peace happen in 2025; but because of his severe injury he never runs for office, and so we are still fighting wars in 2025. The “chaos” is that this series of causes and effects is entirely unpredictable. Who would ever have thought that a butterfly flapping its wings in Dover, Delaware would prevent world peace in 2025?

But we do know this. When you do acts of kindness for people, at least one of those people is going to change their heart just a little bit and pass that kindness along to someone else. If you do one act of kindness every three days, there will be a lot of people you “cause” to do more acts of kindness. The “effect” will be a world that is just a little bit better than when you got here. You may never see the “chaotic” effect your life has on the world—a chaos of blessing, a cascade of hope. But you will have done well.

Restored Stained Glass Windows

Remember the Meeting that we had about the stored stained glass windows that have been in crates in the bell tower for 50 yrs.? At that meeting it was decided to have the windows cleaned, framed, lighted and installed on the west wall of the Women Fellowship Room! Well one of the three windows is at the window restoration company and being worked on, it will take about three months to finish each window. At this time there is a family interested in memorializing the restoration of this window to a deceased loved one.

What the committee is asking if there is any other Families that would like to pay for one of the larger windows to be restoration in memory of a loved one. Each window is being restored at a cost of \$3,400.00 plus the rounded sections on two of the windows will cost \$1,800.00 each. The total cost of restoration will be \$13,800! Plaques will be install to recognize the people that help to defray the expense of each window!
